Whether you're interested in piping, fiddle, harp, Gaelic song or language, we have something for everyone.

AREAS OF STUDY

Gaelic Language - If you have never studied Gaelic or have minimal exposure to the language, sign up for Beginner. If you have some Gaelic but have trouble getting past "Hi, how are you?" then Emerging Speaker is a good choice. Try Advanced if you can carry on short conversations in Gaelic, or Immersion for the total Gaelic experience with limited English. Our instructors include:

Dr. Michael Newton

A true Gaelic scholar and prolific author, Dr Newton earned his PhD from the University of Edinburgh.

Rachel McPherson

Raonaid, a career Gaelic teacher, has lived on several different Hebridean islands and absorbed the dialects and customs of each.

Margie Beaton

Margie grew up on the island of Eriskay, emigrated to Cape Breton, and is a key player in the Nova Scotian Gaelic revival.

Frances Acar

Hailing from the Isle of Barra, Frances is not only a superb Gaelic teacher but also a fine Gaelic singer.

INSTRUMENTS:

Fiddle - Ewen Henderson

Equally at home on pipes, fiddle, and singing Gaelic songs, Ewen is a true West Highland "triple threat".

Harp - Ingrid Henderson

Ingrid is in great demand as an accompanist, recording artist, and soloist on the Scottish clàrsach.

Piping - Barry Shears

Barry is an award-winning piper, composer, author, and the foremost exponent of Cape Breton piping.

Instrument-specific instruction will be provided in bagpipe, fiddle, and harp. Students should bring their own instruments. If you play a different instrument, you are welcome to attend classes to learn repertoire and traditions. Indicate your level on the registration form.

Evenings will include *traditional music sessions* for instrumentalists.

Gaelic Song - Kathleen MacInnes

This Gaelic recording artist and actress is known for her unique singing voice and style. Emmy Lou Harris? No, ma'am! Emmy Lou UIST!

Study a broad range of songs in your morning classes. Singing is such an important part of Gaelic culture that in addition to being offered as a major subject, there will be ample opportunity for all participants to learn and sing together.

WHAT IS A TRY IT! CLASS?

Each afternoon, following your chosen major subject, you will have the opportunity to learn something new in a *Try It!* class. Gaelic song majors might take the *Try Gaelic!* class to explore the language in which they are singing. Fiddle majors might attend *Try Gaelic Song!* and learn the words to some of the most beautiful melodies in the world.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Each day begins with your selected major class. After lunch break, students may take advantage of our *Try It!* classes. You may return to the same class each day or select a new one. Selections may be made on the first day of the Fèis.

In true Scottish style, each evening we have a cèilidh and session opportunities. Other special events include dancing, a waulking and a special faculty concert on Friday night. Saturday is our final no-holds-barred cèilidh until dawn.

Check in: Begins Tuesday, June 14th at 3:00 p.m. with a welcome ceilidh in the dorms.

Meals:

Meal service begins with dinner on Tuesday, June 14th through breakfast on Sunday, June 19th. Fort Worden's on-site caterer can meet a variety of special dietary needs. Please contact the fèis committee at feis-help@slighe.com to discuss your needs.

Accommodations:

Accommodations at Fort Worden are fully accessible individual dormitory-style rooms with shared bathroom facilities. All on-site registrations include sheets, blankets, pillow and case, towels, floor mats, hand soap and glass. We recommend shower shoes and a bathrobe.

In addition, we offer limited premium housing in one of the Victorian officer's quarters. This option is available for *an additional \$300 per double bedroom*. Registration Options:

FULL-TIME GAELIC SCHOLAR OR MUSICIAN:

Registration includes major subject classes, *Try It!* classes, and all evening events. Stay at Fort Worden, or offsite. The first 50 full registrants receive a free ticket to the Living Traditions concert.

SAMPLE:

Registration includes *Try It!* classes in the afternoons and all evening events. Meals and accommodations included.

COMPANION:

Registrants attending with a "Full Registrant" will be able to attend all evening events. Meals and accommodation included.

WEEKENDER:

This two day option includes all classes and events for Friday and Saturday. Meals and accommodations included (dinner Friday through breakfast on Sunday.)
